APPROVED USES

AUSTEDO XR® (deutetrabenazine) extended-release tablets and AUSTEDO® (deutetrabenazine) tablets are prescription medicines that are used to treat:

- the involuntary movements (chorea) of Huntington's disease. AUSTEDO XR and AUSTEDO do not cure the cause of the involuntary movements, and it does not treat other symptoms of Huntington's disease, such as problems with thinking or emotions.
- movements in the face, tongue, or other body parts that cannot be controlled (tardive dyskinesia).

It is not known if AUSTEDO XR and AUSTEDO are safe and effective in children.

What is Huntington's disease (HD) chorea?

SYMPTOMS AND CAUSES OF HD CHOREA

HD is a genetic brain disorder that causes an abnormal increase in the release of dopamine. Dopamine is a brain chemical responsible for movement, and increased amounts in the brain can cause chorea. Chorea is a symptom of HD that causes uncontrollable body movement.

Chorea is one of the most visible symptoms of HD and can be treated

Chorea can be a burden to people with HD and those who care for them, impacting daily life and relationships. Care partners reported chorea as the most impactful symptom of HD.

What HD chorea signs look like:



Flicking the fingers



Flailing arms or legs



Shrugging shoulders



Grimacing



Twisting or jerking



Irregular eye movements or blinking

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION (CONTINUED)

Do not take AUSTEDO XR or AUSTEDO if you:

- have Huntington's disease and are depressed or have thoughts of suicide.
- have liver problems.
- are taking reserpine. Do not take medicines that contain reserpine with AUSTEDO XR or AUSTEDO. If your healthcare provider plans to switch you from taking reserpine to AUSTEDO XR or AUSTEDO, you must wait at least 20 days after your last dose of reserpine before you start taking AUSTEDO XR or AUSTEDO.





THE IMPACT OF HUNTINGTON'S DISEASE (HD) CHOREA

The movements of HD chorea can:



Make walking and climbing stairs difficult



Make getting dressed challenging



Affect your ability to brush teeth or bathe



Affect your ability to eat or chew



Make it difficult to speak clearly



People with chorea cannot stop these movements on their own and the movements may worsen with stress. Over time, these movements cause a loss of independence.

Do not take AUSTEDO XR or AUSTEDO if you:

• are taking a monoamine oxidase inhibitor (MAOI) medicine. **Do not** take an MAOI within 14 days after you stop taking AUSTEDO XR or AUSTEDO. **Do not** start AUSTEDO XR or AUSTEDO if you stopped taking an MAOI in the last 14 days. Ask your healthcare provider or pharmacist if you are not sure.

- are taking tetrabenazine. If your healthcare provider plans to switch you from tetrabenazine to AUSTEDO XR or AUSTEDO, take your first dose of AUSTEDO XR or AUSTEDO on the day after your last dose of tetrabenazine.
- are taking valbenazine.






How to get started

PERSONALIZED DOSING FOR HUNTINGTON'S DISEASE (HD) CHOREA

Your healthcare provider will start you at a low dose of AUSTEDO XR® (deutetrabenazine) extended-release tablets and gradually increase your dose over time. This approach allows your body to get used to the medication and can help with side effects as movements are reduced. This way, your healthcare provider can find a dose that works for you. This process is called titration.

Getting to your maintenance dose

Once you reach a dose that provides effective HD chorea movement reduction and is tolerated, that will become your maintenance dose. If you want to increase your dose, you and your healthcare provider can discuss more dosing options.



Because everyone is different, your maintenance dose will be the one that works specifically for you



IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION (CONTINUED)

Other possible serious side effects include:

• Neuroleptic Malignant Syndrome. Call your healthcare provider right away and go to the nearest emergency room if you develop these signs and symptoms that do not have another obvious cause: high fever, stiff muscles, problems thinking, very fast or uneven heartbeat, or increased sweating.





HOW TO TAKE YOUR MEDICATION







With water



Whole (do not crush or break)



If you cannot swallow AUSTEDO XR®/AUSTEDO® (deutetrabenazine) tablets whole, tell your healthcare provider. You may need a different medication.

The most common side effects of AUSTEDO XR are expected to be similar to AUSTEDO in people with Huntington's disease or tardive dyskinesia.
